Riley was arrested, indicted, tried, and convicted on the testimony of Mona Mitchell, a downtown cocktail waitress who charged that he had kidnapped her from a downtown parking lot, drove her in her own car to a secluded area on Highland Avenue and raped her.

The defendant claimed he had consorted with the waitress but that it was strictly a clientcustomer relationship to which she agreed for a fee of fifty dollars.

Aid For Harlem, Watts

ACCORDING TO A RECENT UPL release. Harlem and the Watts area of Los Angeles--two areas with hardcore Negro unemployment--will get a special assist under plans outlined by Labor Secretary W. Willard Wirtz.

A special three-man team of federal officials, the first such team appointed by the President's Committee on Manpower, will begin work in

Harlem Monday.

The team is comprised of men from the departments of Labor and Health, Education and Welfare and the Office of Economic Opportunity. It will coordinate federal aid programs for maximum effect in meeting job needs.

In Watts, Wirtz said transportation will be provided to bring Negroes to 1,000 available jobs under the Neighborhood Youth Corps program. Lack of transportation has been a main

factor in filling these openings.

Wirtz said too that additional employment service facilities will be created to serve the Watts area. He has authorized the California Employment Service to rent space in a new building in the center of Watts and has provided the money needed to staff it.

IN ADDITION, the California service has been given funds to put a mobile employment

office into Watts.

Arrangements will also be made to provide youth and adult trainees from the Watts area with transportation to the temporary quarters of the Watts skill center opening April 11. A new building is scheduled for construction later.
