TAPES ON RACIAL ISSUES AVAILABLE

NEW YORK -- A series of tape-recorded discussions released by the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions deals with the examiners of dangerous and far-reaching problems in race relations.

One of the programs--entitled "The Fire This Time"--was recorded on the scene during the five-day uprising in the Negro district of Los Angeles last August.

ANOTHER PROGRAM -- called "Have Slums, Will Travel''--contains a critical analysis of a radical education plan offered to Center staff members by Louis Lomax, Negro author and social critic.

Others deal with "The Negro As an American," the question of whether job quotas for Negroes are insults or are compensations for past injustices, whether progress toward better race relations is occurring more rapidly in the South or the North, and where the Negro protest move-

ment seems to be heading. These tapes on racial issues are among 163 recorded programs made available to individuals, educational and religious organizations, civic groups, and radio stations for a nominal handling charge as part of the Center's effort to foster wide and deep discussions of basic questions in modern life.

The tape library, produced at the Center's headquarters in Santa Barbara, California, also features discussions of the requirements for peace and the abolition of war, the impact of technology on human values, the meanings and effects of Supreme Court decisions, the problems of democracy in the emerging nations of Africa and Asia, the ins and outs of modern government, the development and changing aspects of capitalism, socialism and communism, the American character, the principal challenges to democracy in a revolutionary age, and a special series on the personal experiences and viewpoints of the officers and some of the staff members of the Center.

Participants in the programs include leaders from many countries--Robert M. Hutchins, the Center's president; Harry S. Ashmore, Pulitzer prize-winning editor; Sir Muhammad Zafrulla
