"The Crappie Catcher" INFORMATION

FISHING REPORTS remain from good to excellent in nearly every section of Lake Mead. We suggest you get in as much fishing as the budget and the little woman will stand for. Make hay while the sun shines. Go to your favorite fishing holes and follow the tips below, which are reprinted from "Fishing Tips", by the Roddy people.

Reports from the Overton area indicate that both bass and crappie are hitting lures. In the Temple Bar--Iceberg Canyon arm of the lake, minnows are tops for crappie, and dogs are taking bass. Plugging produced practically nothing for us last week at 6 Box Point. We caught a little over a box of crappie on minnows, and landed 12 bass as we rode out a hard blow at 6 Box Point Saturday night. There were three in our party.

If you go to Echo Bay-Overton try Jig Flies or Go-Getters for crappie, and Plastic Worms or Bombers for bass. Take along some shrimp and waterdogs if you want to try for cats. For reliable up-to-the-minute information on where to find the hot spots around Overton, stop at The Overton Sport Shop for bait, and ask Al Biederman. WEED BEDS
