You See, FATHER, There's Enough for All

JACKSON, Miss.--A unique summer training program designed to prepare promising Negro college students for admission to top graduate schools was announced Wednesday by the Carnegie Foundation.

Carnegie announced a grant of \$180,000 to Harvard, Yale and Columbia Universities for the program, which will consist of specially designed seminars and courses selected from the regular summer session of the universities.

ALAN PIFER, acting president of the corporation, said in announcing the program here that the Universities will offer fellowships to those students coming through the summer program who meet the requirements of admission to the graduate schools. The staff of the program will assist students in filing applications to other graduate schools. Pifer said.

One hundred third year students from predominantly Negro colleges will be selected for this summer's program.

The award was one of seven grants totaling \$1,197,150 announced by the corporation.

And More

PITTSBURGH -- Predominantly Negro colleges will participate with Carnegie Tech in a cooperative program in history under a \$477,000 grant from the corporation.

The program will include the development of new curriculum materials in western civilization and American history.

History teachers from the Negro colleges will attend Carnegie Tech as visiting fellows and to take graduate courses, as well as to take part in summer institutes.

These teachers will work with Carnegie Tech's history staff on the new course materials

which will be adapted for use in junior colleges as well as in four-year institutions.

And Still More

PRINCETON, N.J.--A grant of \$300,000 will enable the Educational Testing Service to develop observational techniques and materials that will make it possible to determine how far a four- or five-year-old's thought processes have advanced.

ETS WILL STUDY small groups of children to investigate the sequence of development of certain intellectual skills and the instructional experiences that foster their growth.

The ETS will develop assessment materials and programs for use in the classroom, train teachers in the use of the materials, and produce a teacher training film and instructional pamphlets for teachers.

The staff from ETS will also work and consult with the New York City Board of Education, and others on the orientation of elementary education supervisors and principals and on the training of teachers in the use of the materials.
