

### You Gotta Have Heart

Washington Urban League in the Free D. C. Movement currently engaged in a boycott of local merchants to force enactment of home rule, is believed to have triggered the resignation of its acting president, Henry K. Wil-

However, Willard, vice president, American Security and Trust company, who had been at the helm of the local organization for about 10 months, was evasive about reasons for relin-

quishing the post. Nor would he comment on whether his superiors at AST had asked him to give up his league position, Willard did admit, however, that the boycott issue was an underlying factor.

This, observers theorized, centered around a March 1 statement by Sterling Tucker, executive director which was interpreted as endors-

ing the picketing of D.C. stores.

Tucker said the statement referred to the boycott as a "legitimate means of expression" in the same manner as protest marches, picketing and demonstrations explained that it was not a specific endorsement.

Its major intent, he added, was to stress that the denial of the peoples' basic right of self expression could be expected to result in active forms of protest.

These procedures evolve from specific requests by local officials with mounting racial tension problems and coincide with the administration's policy of stressing long-term Negro needs like housing, jobs and education.

ect of special interest.


