## Co-ed Ambassador

WINSTON-SALEM -- Miss Sylvia Yvonne Sprinkle, a junior will become Winston-Salem State College's first ambassador to India. She will spend the summer in that country under The Experiment in International Living Program.

The experiment is the oldest person-to-person exchange organization of its kind in the United States. The experiment believes that "people learn to live together by living together." The "homestay" is the heart of the program.

Miss Sprinkle will spend one month living in the home of an Indian family--not as a guest but as another member of the family. Her second month will be spent traveling informally through the country with a member of her family and a group of Young Americans or engaged in a project of special interest.

AT THE CONCLUSION of the informal trip, she will spend a few days in a city of major interest somewhere along the route to her point of embarkation for home. She will be out of the United States for about fifty-six days.

An honor student at Winston-Salem State College, Miss Sprinkle is a 1963 honor graduate of Carver High School in Winston-Salem. She is the daughter of Mrs. Thelma S. Joyce of Route 1, Winston-Salem and the late Arthur W. Sprinkle, Sr.

On campus she is secretary of the Student National Education Association, assistant secretary of the Student Government Association, vice president of the junior class, and a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, The Pan-Hellenic Council, the Library Literary Club and the Drama Guild.

Miss Sprinkle was the junior class nominee for campus "Lady of the Year" and the first attendant to Miss SNEA. She is also a tutor in the Experiment in Self-Reliance, the local anti-poverty program.

## You Gotta Have Heart MONEY YES! ADVICE NO!

WASHINGTON--The involvement of the Washington Urban League in the Free D. C. Movement currently engaged in a boycott of local merchants to force enactment of home rule, is believed to have triggered the resignation of its acting president, Henry K. Willard, Jr.

However, Willard, vice president, American Security and Trust company, who had been at the helm of the local organization for about 10 months, was evasive about reasons for relinquishing the post.

Nor would he comment on whether his superiors at AST had asked him to give up his league position, Willard did admit, however, that the boycott issue was an underlying factor.

This, observers theorized, centered around a March 1 statement by Sterling Tucker, executive director which was interpreted as endorsing the picketing of D.C. stores.

Tucker said the statement referred to the boycott as a "legitimate means of expression" in the same manner as protest marches, picketing and demonstrations explained that it was not a specific endorsement.

Its major intent, he added, was to stress that the denial of the peoples' basic right of self expression could be expected to result in active forms of protest.

WASHINGTON--Federal coordinators stationed in major cities where racial trouble was anticipated last summer will be relieved of the same function this year.

The decision stemmed from reported resentment of the special project, administered by the U.S. Community Relations Service.

Mayors of affected cities--principally Chicago and Los Angeles--contended they could handle their own racial problems without federal intervention.

The chief executives, however, expressed willingness to accept federal aid to relieve conditions contributing to racial outbreaks.

THE NEW CRS director, Roger W. Wilkins, nephew of Roy Wilkins, NAACP executive director, after consideration of various staff proposals for riot-prevention programs in Northern cities this summer, decided to follow, instead, routine conciliation procedures.

These procedures evolve from specific requests by local officials with mounting racial tension problems and coincide with the administration's policy of stressing long-term Negro needs like housing, jobs and education.
