## WASTE OF FISH OR GAME

Fish and game are resources belonging to the people of the State and are made available to individuals under conditions designed to give the maximum utilization to the greatest number of people. A person who wastes fish and game or who allows it to spoil because of his carelessness or inepitude can be prosecuted under the provisions of our law.


### LIVE BAIT REGULATIONS

Unless otherwise specified, live bait refers only to live fish. Except where specifically prohibited, it is lawful to take and use live fish for bait from the waters in which you are fishing. However, it is unlawful to seene or to transport live bait unless you have first obtained a seining and transportation permit from the Nevada Fish and Game Commission, or unless such bait is procured from a licensed bait dealer and such transportation is accompanied by a receipt.

Seining and transportation permits may be procured from Fish and Game Commission offices or its personnel throughout the State at no fee. The use of game fish<sup>6</sup> for bait is prohibited except where otherwise specified.

# Wallace 1st Negro SEC Cager

NASHVILLE, Tenn.--Vanderbilt broke the Southeastern Conference color line when they recruited Perry Wallace this week. Outstanding rebounder Wallace who was sought by 80 colleges indicated that he had no misgivings about being the first of his race to play in the SEC.

Wallace said that several northern colleges used the racial angle in an attempt to discourage his signing with a southern school.

"In the first analysis, I thought a long time about becoming the first Negro boy in the SEC," said the 6-5, 217 pound Wallace.

"But coach Roy Skinner is a very sincere person and the fellows of the Vanderbilt team are the nicest I met during all my trips," he said. "I'm willing to work hard and give it a try with these kind of people."

Wallace has been visiting a number of college campuses for the past several weeks. Asked if any of the schools tried to scare him about becoming the first Negro to play in the SEC, Wallace grinned and replied: "Well, it's part of the recruiting for these

"Well, it's part of the recruiting for these schools to find out if you have a preference and then use some angle to discourage you from going to that particular school.

"And, the main thing they would hit in my case was the fact that there were no other Negroes playing in the SEC."
