LI LUN, LAD OF COURAGE, by Carolyn Treffinger. Illustrated by Kurt Wiese. Abington Press, 1947. \$3.00.

SO GREAT WAS Li Lun's fear of the sea that he refused to go on his first fishing voyage—his man-making trip. Such defiance brought swift, stern punishment. Let him stay on land then, his father commanded, and plant rice—plant it on the distant mountain top; and let him not come back until he had grown there seven times as

many grains of rice as he had planted.

The chapter titles tell the story of Li Lun's trials and final triumph; Defiance; Preparation; The Climb; Night; Planting; Mildew; A Visitor; Rain; Rats' Drought;

Harvest; Temple Ceremony. Here is not merely a stirring tale of the courage of a Chinese boy on a lonely island off the coast of China; here is an epic of courage anywhere.

The universal quality and high dramatic value of the story are perfectly reflected in the author's simple, beautiful style and again in Kurt Wiese's lovely

pictures.

CAROLYN TREFFINGER, author of LILUN, LAD OF COURAGE, has been in close contact with children for many years through her work as teacher and principal of an elementary school in the Middle West. Her professional storytelling in libraries, schools, and churches has also given her intimate knowledge of children's tastes in literature.

During the long summer vacations Miss Treffinger has traveled extensively, an activity which is reflected in her writing. Much of her reading, too, has been of other countries and peoples. It was, in fact, something she read in a missionary paper some years ago which gave her the idea for this story. "Oceans of research followed," says Miss Treffinger. The geographical data, characterization of the fisher folk, superstitions and folklore are authentic, not only according to authoritative printed sources but also according to persons who know intimately the Chinese island where the story is set.

KURT WIESE, who illustrated LI LUN, is a well-known and beloved illustrator of children's books. He was born in Germany and lived and traveled in many countries before coming to make his home in the United States many years ago. He loves to draw pictures for children's books, particularly about countries where he has lived. Some of the details in the LI LUN pictures are based on sketches made by Mr. Wiese during the six years he spent in China.
