"World Different - People Same" - Bible Assures Graduates

FALLON--The current generation of American youth "is the best-informed and the most deeply committed to social progress and human welfare of any in history," Senator Alan Bible said in a "40th anniversary" commencement address.

Speaking to the graduating class of Churchill County High School 40 years after his own graduation from the school, Bible said the so-called lost generation of the 1920's has been replaced with the "Volunteer Generation" of the 1960s.

"It's true that some have chosen a life of rebellion, protest and even crime," he said. "But thousands have volunteered to work in slums, in teaching, in religion, in politics and in other fields where there is a positive contribution to the good of mankind."

FOR EVERY YOUTH carrying a picket, the Nevada senator continued, there are thousands carrying "a real sign of peace to foreign lands by volunteering for the Peace Corps."

"It's also true that some of our young men have chosen to burn their draft cards," he said. "But for every one of those there are hundreds in Viet Nam who have volunteered to give their lives in defense of freedom."

Bible said the extreme difficulty of the U.S. position in Viet Nam often tended to obscure its objectives.

"BASICALLY, we went into Viet Nam and we stayed in Viet Nam to assure the survival of liberty--to help repeal militant communist aggression and to give the people of South Viet Nam the right to decide their own future freely," Bible declared. "We must stand by our com-

mitments there so long as the people of South Viet Nam ask us to do so."

Bible called the U.S. decision to go into Viet Nam a choice of responsibility over expediency and added: "We shall continue to choose responsibility."

Bible urged the graduates to accept their responsibilities as individuals and to prepare for futures in a world of growing technological complexity. "But I am optimistic about your future--the future of our country and your ability to be part of it," he said. "And we are only on the threshold of man's progress."

BIBLE WAS among 19 boys and 17 girls who graduated from Churchill County High School in 1926. "The world today is nothing like the world of my graduation day," he told the 1966 graduates. "But people--you and I--are just about the same, and our interest lies in the future."

Senior Health Program

WASHINGTON--About 21,000 of the estimated 24,000 Nevadans who are 65 and older have enrolled in the voluntary Supplementary Medical Insurance Program, Sen. Howard W. Cannon said today.

THE SUPPLEMENTARY plan is an adjunct to the basic medicare program established by the 1965 amendments to the Social Security Act. Under the plan, individuals contribute \$3 a month, which is matched by the government, for insurance against the cost of physicians' services and certain other health costs.

Noting that May 31 was the deadline for persons who reached 65 before March 1 to enroll for the supplementary health coverage, Cannon said those who failed to enroll generally will have to wait more than two years before their protection against the costs of medical care can begin.

Cannon said about 1,000 Nevadans have elected not to enroll in the program, and about 2,000 had not reached a decision at the time Cannon issued the statement.

Nationally, 90 per cent of the aged have enrolled in the new medical insurance program and five per cent have decided against enrollment.
