# NEGRO NURSES NEEDED

PHILADELPHIA - (NPI) -- The vital need for Negro nurses to offset the critical nationwide shortage was stressed by a leading authority on the nursing profession during Future Nurse Club Day at Temple university hospital school of nursing.

Mrs. M. Elizabeth Carnegie, associate editor, Nursing Outlook, official magazine of the National League for Nursing, addressing a group of high school girls, told them:

With America crying for nurses to meet the health needs of the people, a very important source of supply is being overlooked -- YOU.

THE OCCASION was an informal nurse recruitment session sponsored by Ex-Lax, Inc., in cooperation with the university and the Southeastern Pennsylvania League for Nursing.

The girls, students at Simon Gratz high school, also received first hand information from nursing educators and Army nurses on the advantages of nursing as a career.

Pointing out that from 1951 to 1965 no special effort was made to recruit Negro students, Mrs. Carnegie asserted that they constitute only three per cent of the nation's total professional nursing population of 621,000 although they represent er cent of the nation's total population.

Also enlarging upon the "critical shortage" of nurses was Robert A.M. Peterson, vice president, Ex-Lax, who saw a worsening of the situation when the federal government's Medicare program goes into effect July 1.

Other speakers were Temple university hospital school of nursing first-year student Estelle Banks, who told of her experience as a student nurse; Army Nurse 1st Lt. Annie R. Clemons, of her experience during the Korean War and Navy Nurse Lt./jg Flora M. Page, of the advantages of a nursing career in her branch of the armed forces.
