

WORLD OF BOOKS

THE NEW RADICALS, By PAUL JACOBS and SAUL LANDAU; Published By RANDOMHOUSE, 333 pp., \$4.95.

The authors, in a two-part treatise on the so-called new left movement, have lumped together in this category such organizations as the DuBois Clubs, the Progressive Labor Party and SDS (Students for a Democratic Society). They also include among the "new radicals" the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), because it has recently veered from its original mode of operation.

However, in this writer's opinion, this does not justify SNCC's inclusion under the "left movement" category, nor can its new policy be termed "radical" in the implied sense of the word.

THE AUTHORS, in the lengthy introduction which describes the membership, programs and prospects of the groups analyzed, evince concern about what is being increasingly voiced and written--the lack of a coordinated program. More specifically, the "ideology" too often has been criticized, rather than understood. "Ideology," could be an awareness or development of a hard core program of tactics to obtain "coalition" politics or a unified, purposeful frontal action.

The second part contains major documents illustrating the varying perspectives of the movements under attention.

THE CRUCIFIXION OF PETE McCABE, By JACK PEARL, Published by TRIDENT PRESS, \$4.95.

A gripping, suspenseful, action-filled novel by the author of many thrillers, including "Stockade" (Trident Press, 1965) this is a tale of a man who finds himself judged and convicted by friends and neighbors on the basis of a rumor so wild that "it must be true..."

It is a startling story of a man awakening to an ordinary day as an executive of a publishing firm to find himself intricately and helplessly maligned because of a fantastic lie told by his secretary following an uneventful office picnic.

Of course, truth does out. He is vindicated, but not before his highly capable and trusted secretary--unattractive of face but voluptuous of form, on which the rumor hinges--is killed after being sexually assaulted. Those who like their stories jam-packed with chills and suspense won't put this one down.

BOOK NOTES: Georgia Rep.-elect Julian Bond, Atlanta, barred from his seat in the Georgia House of Representatives for the second time, will take a six-month leave of absence from his post as communications director, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee to write a book, tentatively titled **THE GEORGIA HOUSE IS NOT A HOME**. Holt, Rinehart & Winston are being considered for the publishing contract.

THE CHICAGO COMMISSION on Human Relations' Mayor's Committee on New Residents has published a **CULTURAL ENRICHMENT GUIDE** designed to assist schools and volunteer centers wishing to expand the horizons of their students. This 32-page fact-filled booklet includes, in addition to some 150 field trip suggestions, a checklist of trip planning and a list of printed materials containing current local events information.

Meredith Seeks Elective Post As Independent

NEW YORK - (NPI)--Upon returning to New York after being wounded by shotgun blasts near Hernando, Miss., James Meredith announced he had asked the board of elections to postpone a hearing challenging his eligibility to run for the post of delegate to the state Constitutional Convention from Harlem.

His name had been withdrawn from nomination by the Harlem Democrats for Action. Meredith, currently a student at Columbia University Law School, said he plans to run as an independent.

He returned to the city to recuperate from wounds suffered during his march on Jackson, Miss. Meredith said he planned to organize a massive march from Canton, Miss., to Jackson and added that unless he is given assurance that he will be protected, he will be armed during the march.

Doctors said he would need a week's rest before he could reorganize his "reunion" march to Mississippi.

In the meantime, Dr. Martin Luther King who began his "Mississippi Freedom March" with 150 persons was halted when two white men blocked the line of march with a truck and refused to move. Both were arrested. Police found a .22 caliber rifle in the truck.

The march was late starting because Negroes were incensed over Meredith's alleged eviction from William Bowld hospital in Memphis. Dr. King denounced the action at a mass rally in Memphis and later a protest march was staged with demonstrators carrying signs in front of the hospital while police stood guard.

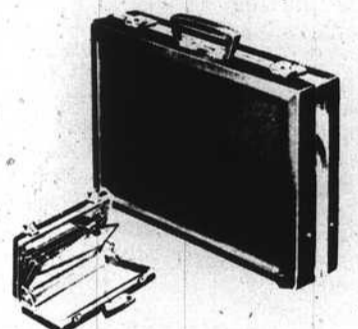

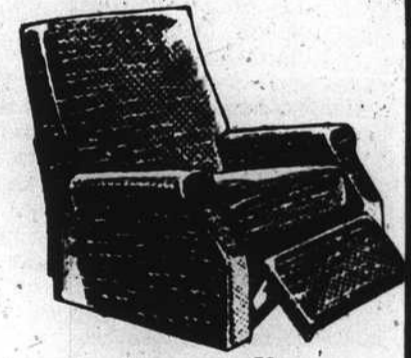

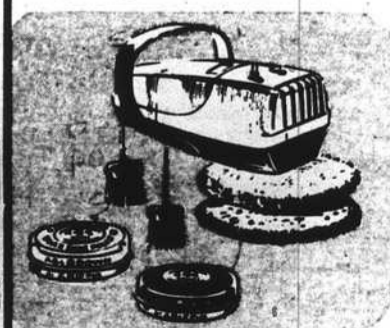
