THE STUDENTS WILL travel over 7,000 miles by charter bus as they visit the historic freedom centers of the American Heritage. They will return to Las Vegas, July 44.

On the sojourn, they will visit Congress, Washington, D.C., and the Parliament of Canada at Ottawa. During a six-day stay in New York City, they will observe the operations of the United Nations and take their meals in the private dining room of the Delegates to the United Na-tions. They will) also, dine at the International House of Columbia University, visit cultural centers of New York, and take the famous threehour boat trip around Manhattan Island.

Included among historic places in American history to be visited are Mt. Vernon, Arlington National Cemetery (where they will place a wreath on the grave of the late President John F. Kennedy), Valley Forge, Gettysburg, Constitution Hall, Boston, Plymouth Rock, Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts. In Boston, they will retrace the ride of Paul Revere. On the way to Canada, they will visit Niagara Falls.




