ing from California with students from Hawaii and California. The youngsters were the guests of the Desert Inn - Stardust Complex Tuesday night and were billeted at the Stardust Hotel.

First, though, there was a seven o'clock dinner for the pilgrims at the Odd Fellows Hall, at 9th and Fremont streets where District Judge John Mowbray was the featured speaker. Following the dinner, the students were guests of the Desert Inn at the second show of "Hello America!"

After spending the night at the Stardust Hotel, the chartered bus with its precious cargo departed early Wednesday morning on the 17th Annual United Nations Pilgrimage for Youth.

THE STUDENTS WILL travel over 7,000 miles by charter bus as they visit the historic freedom centers of the American Heritage. They will return to Las Vegas, July 14.

On the sojourn, they will visit Congress, Washington, D.C., and the Parliament of Canada at Ottawa. During a six-day stay in New York City, they will observe the operations of the United Nations and take their meals in the private dining room of the Delegates to the United Nations. They will also, dine at the International House of Columbia University, visit cultural centers of New York, and take the famous three-hour boat trip around Manhattan Island.

Included among historic places in American history to be visited are Mt. Vernon, Arlington National Cemetery (where they will place a wreath on the grave of the late President John F. Kennedy), Valley Forge, Gettysburg, Constitution Hall, Boston, Plymouth Rock, Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts. In Boston, they will retrace the ride of Paul Revere. On the way to Canada, they will visit Niagara Falls.

Nevada high school students who joined the groups from Hawaii and California for the patriotic pilgrimage are William Egbert, Churchill County High School; Fallon; Paulette Krick, Bishop Gorman High School; Delight Guskj, John Drake, Jr., and John Merrill, all of Las Vegas High School. There is also a Pilgrim from Mineral County High School, Hawthorne, and of course, Albert Crosby, also of Las Vegas High School.

STATE'S FIRST NEGRO ADULT PAROLE OFFICER

George Reed, Nevada's Chief Parole and Probation Officer announced, this week, the appointment of Reverend Horace L. Gholston to the position of Adult Parole and Probation Officer--District 4 (The Las Vegas area).

Rev. Gholston reported for duty in his new post yesterday, June 15, and will go to Carson City immediately for training under George Reed.

The new appointee was ordained as a Methodist Minister in 1955, and attended San Francisco State College. He is an army veteran of World War II, with a background in both law enforcement and business.

The 44-year-old Rev. Gholston resides at 1956 Susan Street, Las Vegas with his wife and three children.

Commenting on the appointment of the first Negro to hold such a post in the State, Governor Grant Sawyer said "Nevada has one of the finest parole and probation systems in the country. The addition of Reverend Gholston is another step forward in a program that has won widespread recognition. We know he will do a fine job."
