

WE ARE NOW entering a transitional period in Lake Mead fishing. The spawning period is over and the fish have moved out of the shallow spawning grounds into deep recesses of our mammoth fishing hole.

Night fishing for crappie remains fairly productive. For the past two weeks, we have have had excellent catches of crappie in Cathedral Cove which is located on the western shoreline immediately opposite Sheep Island in the Echo Bay area.

Our luck with bass has not been anything to brag about. The old timers who guide fishing parties in the Overton-Echo Bay arm of Lake Mead have been spotted fishing deep holes--30 to 40 feet, or deeper. They are reported to be making fairly good catches of bass, but not nearly so good as they were doing a month ago.

Our best tip (if you fish that region of Mead) is to keep a sharp look-out for the guides' boats and follow their movements. They know their fishing spots better than anyone. They know from previous years, where to hunt bass when they move off their spawning grounds. If they don't find them in one spot, they quickly move to another hole that paid-off in yesteryears. If you play follow the leader behind the movements of these professionals, you will learn their secret holes and also catch more bass than you would by following your own trial and error methods.

If the bass are biting, the old timers will lead you to them. If you don't catch fish in their spots, the first time you follow-the-leader, chart the spot carefully by landmarks in order to find that hole the next time you fish the area.

TO ACCURATELY MARK any spot on water, you search for a landmark that is easy to see, and to remember, on each shoreline, so that a line drawn between these two markers will pass smack-dab through the middle of your boat. This alignment must be repeated by selecting two other landmarks which, when aligned, will also pass through the spot.

You must have two lines of landmark alignment which cross each other. The spot where they cross is the location of your boat which is right over the old pro's fishing hole.

Study the features of your landmarks carefully so there will be no question in your mind when you return to the area at some later date.

The old saying that X marks the spot is your key to returning to the exact fishing hole every time you want to fish it.

Along with Pro Charles Sifford, expected in attendance are Wilt "Stilt" Chamberlain, Big Bill Russell, Billy Eckstine, Joe Louis, Cassius Clay, Dick "Night Train" Lane, Jackie Robinson and of course, Jim Brown, the founder of the NIEU and a low scoring golfer who copped the National Football League first place last year in Miami.
