**First Negro Member
Of AEC - A Nabrit**

HOUSTON - (NPI)--The appointment of Dr. Samuel M. Nabrit to the Atomic Energy Commission placed a second university president named Nabrit in a top-level government position. Dr. Nabrit's brother, James M. Nabrit, Jr., is deputy U.S. representative to the United Nations, and heads Howard University in Washington.

PRESIDENT, Texas Southern University, Dr. Nabrit is the first Negro member of the Atomic Energy Commission. He was a member of the National Science Board from 1956 to 1962 and was president of the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools from 1960 to 1961.

Dr. Nabrit has served as chairman of the department of biology at Atlanta University. He has been TSU president for 11 years.

Both Dr. Nabrit and his brother were appointed to their government positions by President Johnson. Other Negroes named by the President to top positions include Dr. Robert C. Weaver, Secretary of Housing and Urban Development; Dr. Andrew F. Brimmer, governor, Federal Reserve Board; Hobart Taylor, director, Export-Import bank; Thurgood Marshall, U.S. solicitor-general; and Clifford L. Alexander, Jr., associate special counsel to the President.

RAMSEY LEWIS SUED

CHICAGO - (NPI)--Ramsey Lewis has been sued for \$2 million by two former members of his trio, bassist Eldee Young and drummer Isaac (Red) Holt. The two charged that Lewis, in firing them, used "fraud and deceit" to deprive them of their rightful assets in the partnership formed in 1955. In another legal action, they sought to restrain Lewis from using the title "Ramsey Lewis Trio."

Sorority Honors Studio

LOS ANGELES - (NPI)--Columbia Pictures corporation will receive an award from the Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority during the national convention of the Greek-letter organization, Aug. 14-20. It will mark the first time a major Negro organization has honored a motion picture company. Columbia is being cited for its use of Negroes in non-stereotyped roles in motion pictures and its awareness of the need to develop acting talent among all groups.

Medical Study Costly

NEW YORK - (NPI)--The high cost of medical study discriminates against the poor, studies of medical education have revealed.

The studies cited two major problems facing medical education today: Regional quotas, requiring students to be residents of the state, and the expensiveness of medical study, keeping medicine a rich man's profession.

According to Dr. John E. Dietrick, dean of Cornell university medical college, the real weakness of medical education has been fiscal. Unlimited federal funds have been available for research, but this year none has gone to medical education, he said.

"The American Medical association didn't like federal money for education," he said. "They were afraid of government interference."

As a result, many students--especially poor ones--avoid the long, expensive years of medical study, at a time when the nation has a scarcity of doctors.

Secession?

LOS ANGELES - (NPI)--Watts should secede from Los Angeles and incorporate as "Freedom City," Cliff Vaughn, regional director, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, has proposed. The plan was applauded by Norman B. Houston, president, NAACP's central branch--who said the plan probably would perpetuate, rather than dilute, Negro predominance in the area -- and by Louis Smith, CORE and Allen Jamal of the black nationalist group "Us," among other.

No Searches

WASHINGTON - (NPI)--A federal judge has been ordered to enjoin local police from illegal searches of Negroes' homes, which were described as "the most flagrant invasions of privacy ever to come under the scrutiny of a federal court." More than 300 houses in the Negro area were searched without warrants after a policeman was killed in December, 1964. Two Negro brothers were accused in the killing.
