

## FISH SMOKING

There's nothing more delicious than hickory-smoked fish. Here's a quick and simple way to make a smoker and prepare fish in this succulent mode

CLEAN AND SCALE your fish, leaving head and tail on. If your fish weighs more than a pound and a half, filet the fish.

Prepare enough brine solution to cover the prepared fish. Dissolve 2 cups of salt in a gallon of water to make proper solution. Let your fish soak in the brine for at least 8 hours. If your fish, or filets are thick, soak 10 hours.

Rinse your brine-soaked fish with fresh water and pat fish dry with paper towels.

Your fish is now ready for smoking. An excellent "smoke house" can be made from an old refrigerator—one with metal panels inside—(not plastic, because the plastic is likely to blister or ignite if smoking temperature goes above 150 degrees.)

PLACE YOUR FISH on the shelves of the

PLACE YOUR FISH on the shelves of the refrigerator so that the edges of your fish do not touch the sides or other pieces of fish. There must be an area completely surrounding each fish, or piece of fish, to allow the flesh to smoke evenly.

Place a single-burner hot plate in bottom of refrigerator. Turn it on "low heat". Cover the hotplate colls with enough pieces of well-soaked hickory chips.

Close the "smokehouse" door and let her smoke for 10 to 12 hours. When you take your smoked fish out of the smoker, you are in for a treat when you taste that completely different taste in fish.

The fish needs no further cooking. It can be eaten just as it comes out of the "smokehouse". The smoked fish should be kept refrigerated to prevent mold and spoilage.

If you plan to keep the smoked fish for a period of time, you should double wrap each piece in freezer paper, and store in deep freeze.


