## Election Code Reform Campaign Issue Of Former Chief Deputy Registrar

Dave Branch, who recently resigned from his position as Clark County Chief Deputy Registrar of Voters, and is a candidate for State Assemblyman in District #2 (City of North Las Vegas), stated that his decision to file for office stemmed from research he had made on Nevada's outdated Election Code. Branch said that the tremendous growth of Clark and Washoe Counties makes the present Code untenable to live with.

Pointing out that Nevada law makes it mandatory that the County Clerk or Registrar of Voters shall: "Split precincts when they have reached a total of 400 registered voters", Branch said "This becomes a burdensome and expensive procedure to do".

To illustrate his point, the former Chief Deputy said that "At this time, Clark County has 318 precincts" (based on the recent registration drive conducted by both political parties) and that "it has become a reality that if the present law is not amended, Clark County will have to add at least another 100 to 150 voting machines to accommodate the added increase of voters and precincts at a minimum cost of \$1,800 per machine or a total cost of \$270,000 to the taxpayers of Clark County."

Solution (through legislation) for the problem, according to Branch is

"FIRST: Decrease the number of precincts and allow for creation of voting divisions within the precincts"

"SECOND: A slight change in the law that would allow for the addition of

a voters change of address on his present affidavit, and the addition of his new precinct--without his having to re-register".

According to Branch, the latter change, alone, "would save at least \$50,000 a year on work load".

Branch said that his first item on suggested reform laws "would result in a savings of over \$270,000 this coming year, alone, by not having to purchase more voting machines".

"Should I be successful in my contest for Assembly", Branch said, "I feel that my fellow members of the Legislature will listen and act accordingly based upon my experience with this present problem as Chief Deputy Registrar of Voters for Clark County".

Dave Branch first came to Nevada in 1940 and lived in Ely, White Pine County, where his family still resides. He moved to California where he completed his education after which he returned to New Mexico where he became active in political and civic circles until he again took up residency in Nevada in 1962.

He is married and has six children--five of whom are in school. Two sons attend Rancho High School, and another is a student at the Ed Von Tobel Jr. High School. A daughter is in Tom Williams Elementary School.

Branch is a member of the Clark County Democratic Central Committee, North Las Vegas Democrat Club, and the Las Vegas Young Democrats. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus, and Nevada State President of Latins International.

He was for six years a representative of the New Mexico State Legislature, and is Past State Chairman, Young Democrats of New Mexico, and Past State Chaplain of New Mexico State Elks Association.

Dave Branch was one of six young men chosen from the State of New Mexico to attend the NATO Conference on Youth in Europe in 1960.
