NEW YORK - (NPI) --During the last 10 years, 227 homes and businesses were bombed by racists, an Anti-Defamation League study has revealed. Forty people involved with the civil rights movement have been murdered, thousands of Klan crosses burned, dozens of beatings and floggings, and so many Negro churches and homes burned that an accurate count is impossible, ADL said.

So. African Tops In Art

ORLANDO WEST, South Africa - (NPI) --First prize in South Africa's annual "Artists of Fame and Promise" competition, in which more than 900 artists' works were entered, went to a black African for his crayon drawing of "Peter's Denial." Louis Maghubela, 27-year-old high school graduate with little formal art training, won the first prize of \$1,400, and a plane trip to Europe. Already an artist of some fame, his works have been exhibited in London, he has established a reputation as a mosaicist.

MEDICS AIR PROTEST

ATLANTA - (NPI) --Negro physicians and dentists from eight southern states met recently to air their protests and dissatisfaction with Health, Education and Welfare officials over discriminatory practices in Southern hospitals in direct violation of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. More than 75 doctors attended the historic meet, including, Dr. Leonidas H. Berry, Chicago, president, National Medical association.

DR. BERRY was guest speaker at the conference's noon luncheon, at which time he pointed out that Chicago and other areas in the North were equally as guilty of discrimination against Negro doctors and their patients although they have received funds for the newly instituted Medicare program.

The Atlanta Conference was initiated by a five-man Atlanta committee of three physicians, one dentist and one layman which had investigated conditions in local hospital and discovered that they had received federal funds for Medicare programs but had not complied with the guidelines of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Members of the committee are: Dr. Otis W. Smith, chairman; Albert M. Davis, secretary; James B. Ellison, treasurer; and Roy C. Bell, public information officer; and Mrs. Edward T. Clayton, coordinator.

THE GROUP had previously aired their findings and grievances before HEW officials in Washington who promised that they would re-investigate Atlanta Hospitals to determine whether or not they are in compliance with the civil rights law.

Four of the Washington officials were present at the Atlanta conference but did not state what they had learned to date. The HEW officials were Dr. Leo J. Ghegig, Deputy Surgeon General; Atty. N.J. Lobassi, HEW legal counselor; Robert J. Nash, HEW Chief Compliance Officer; and Mrs. Sherrie Arnstein, staff assistant, office of the Secretary of HEW.

The meet was sponsored by the Atlanta Committee on Implementation (of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act); the Atlanta Medical association; the North Georgia Dental society, the National Urban league and the Southern Christian Leadership conference.
