

SENATOR CANNON SUGGESTS A CHECK

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The National Science Foundation has been asked by Nevada Senator Howard W. Cannon to take immediate action to discontinue policies which discriminate against small universities in the granting of federal research contracts.

CANNON ADDRESSED a public letter to Dr. Leland Haworth, Director of the National Science Foundation, and to key members of the Congress, in which he deplored alleged favoritism toward big universities.

The Senator said that "In recent years, competitive inequities have increased rather than diminished," and he charged that it is "now common practice for universities to pirate each other's 'name professors' with 'reputations' that command thousands of dollars in government research grants for the university" that can offer higher salaries.

"Hampered by geographical location and limited state budgets, the smaller, developing institutions can afford neither the researchers nor the facilities to improve their competitive position," Cannon said.

THE SENATOR pointed to a bill he supports now pending in the Senate which addresses itself to the inequity and stated he hoped that the Administration will recognize the inherent merit of the bill and "put into practice now its workable and equitable provisions."

The senator also pointed to two research proposals now under consideration from the University of Nevada for which NSF claimed it had insufficient funds. He said that the University's Physics Department had made great strides but now faced an unfair competitive situation with regard to government research grants.

Y.O.C. Program Praised

Pursuant to a story appearing in the VOICE on a recent appointment of Youth Opportunity Corps trainee Bertha Harris to a permanent job status at City Hall, Assistant Manager Bill Adams made the following statement to the VOICE on City participation in the program.

"THE CITY of Las Vegas has actively participated in the Neighborhood Youth Corps Program since the Summer of 1965. During this time, approximately 225 youths have experienced job training with the City. Many diversified vocations have been introduced to the youth as a result of this training; drafting, land survey, automotive servicing, duplicating machinery, general office, Library Science and PBX are a few vocations presented.

"The City has hired some of these youths on a full-time basis. The Personnel Department's receptionist began as a Y.O.C. worker. Another clerk aide is now working for the City as mail clerk and relief PBX operator. A physical inventory clerk for the Finance Department was also placed on a full-time basis.

"The present summer program has been expanded with more youths participating, in comparison with the Winter program; therefore the general quality has been improved."
