LAW GROUP CONVENES Green Power

DETROIT - (NPI)--The National Bar association has urged President Johnson to appoint a Negro federal judge in the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in the South. Strong efforts to improve the position of the Negro lawyer throughout the nation were revealed during the 41st annual convention of the law group.

THE ASSOCIATION also adopted a resolution informing R. Sargent Shriver, chief of the nation's War on Poverty, that he is expected to give full recognition to Negroes in hiring attorneys for his legal services to the poor. The same resolution, approved unanimously by the 250 delegates, also criticized President Johnson for "giving unstintingly of our funds and money to the cause of freedom abroad, while economizing on opportunity and freedom at home."

A brilliant array of convention speakers included Richmond M. Flowers, Attorney General of Alabama, R. Sargent Shriver, John Doar, Assistant Attorney General of the United States, and Detroit, Congressman. Flowers, one of the most liberal elected white officials in the South, received a standing ovation following a 45-minute luncheon address. During the speech, he traced his early association with Negroes, in which he admitted to prejudice, and then told of his reversal on the racial question.

FEDERAL JUDGE William H. Hastie, of the Third Circuit Court of Appeals, was featured speaker at the annual banquet.

Atty. William S. Thompson, Washington, D.C. civil leader and president, of the capital branch of the Urban League, came in for special praise in a resolution from the membership thanking him for his efforts in helping to formulate the five-day program.

The 1967 convention will be held in Houston, Texas.

JACKSON, Miss. - (NPI)--Negroes need green power, not black power, the Rev. Walter E. Fauntroy told the convention of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Rev. Fauntroy said "We need green, economic power in this country. We need to get it to tap every source of power available to us...black and white." Nothing less than a \$100 billion budget could change conditions of the masses of Negroes, the aide to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., added.

Black Power

NEW YORK - (NPI) -- Interpretations of "black power" seem to be the current fad these days. The newest slant, being distributed throughout the 3.3 million-member United Presbyterian church, is an edited version of a 3,000-word document drafted last month by an interdenominational conference of Negro ministers. It says in part: "The search for power is a legitimate search; the Negro church is one with the Negro people in the search for power in order that power may be enhanced by love, and love may be empowered to achieve a just society..."

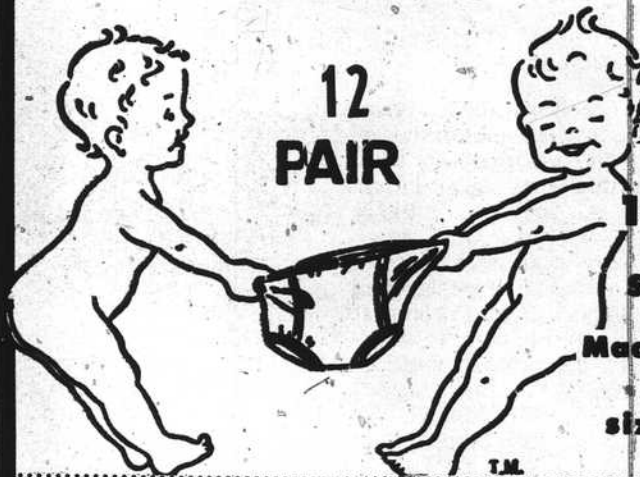

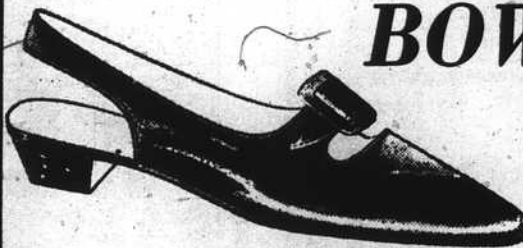
