TO ACCEPT WHITES OR NOT IS THE QUESTION

JACKSON, Miss. - (NPI)--Should whites be excluded from the civil rights movement--or welcomed?

Two national rights organizations took actions headed in opposite directions on this question.

THE STUDENT Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, in a position paper recently made public, declared that Negroes must cut themselves off from white people, "if we are to proceed toward liberation."

SNCC leaders said they were prepared to give up white financial support because they felt such support would "entwine" them "in the tentacles of the white power complex that controls this country."

All the signers of the document agree that whites should have at best only a minor role in the civil rights movement. Sources close to SNCC say few whites are left in the organization.

Meanwhile, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference moved in the opposite direction as it approved admittance of white members to SCLC's currently all-Negro executive board.

Cooperation with whites in non-violent tactics will continue to be SCLC's method of reaching the goal of integration, said the Rev. Walter E. Fauntroy of Washington.

Harmonious, nonviolent "black and white power" is the only sure way to progress for Negroes, he told the SCLC convention.
