NEGRO PRESS INTERNATIONAL SOME MULTIBILLION-DOLLAR PROPOSALS FOR SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES may be in serious trouble in Congress. The problem is the clever politicking of Sen. Wayne Morse, (D-Ore.)

Morse is tacking a rider to the higher education bill, which gives home rule to the District of Columbia. Congress has turned down home rule bills before, and if this one gets the same treatment, also turned down will be the billion dollar education proposal.

A second big money proposal requested by the President, has been upped to three times what the White House asked for. Democratic liberals agree that the \$1.3 billion requested by the President for school-aid is far too little--but they have not as yet conceded that the \$3.2 billion which Morse succeeded in bringing out of the Senate Education subcommittee is advisable, in view of the present inflationary economic trends.
