## **Pre-School Training Set**

Temple Beth Sholom Pre-School officials and the board of Operation Independence today announced a cooperative training program for teacher aides and Neighborhood Youth Corps workers in the Head Start program.

UNDER THE program, the teacher aides and NYC workers will receive training at the Temple's pre-school, one of the most highly regarded in Nevada, Robert Trimble, Operation Independence, Executive Board chairman, said.

"Without the marvelous cooperation of Mrs. Lloyd Katz, chairman of the Temple's preschool and her board, this program could never have been initiated," Trimble added.

Some 120 children are currently enrolled

Some 120 children are currently enrolled in the Head Start project and in Operation Independence pre-schools, mainly from disadvantaged families.

The training program will start this Fall with the teacher aides and NYC workers slated to complete the sessions during the school term.
