The Minnesota Vikings' FRANK TARKENTON had a field day Sunday against the Los Angeles Rams as the Vikings knocked the Rams out of their comfortable perch of a first place tie standing in the National Football League's Western division...Minnesota's 35-7 victory over the hapless Rams marked the Vikings first win of the season...TARKENTON passed for three of the Viking touchdowns and scored on a bootleg play in the third quarter.
