My name is Beverly McGhee, and I am 16 years old. I was born in Las Vegas, September


12, 1949 and have lived here over since. I am a Senior at Ranche fligh School. As an honorary member of the Pép Club, I enjoyed the trip to Disneyland

phy. When I complete my high school education, I plan to attend College. I would like to attend the University of South-


ern California and major in elementary school teaching.
