PITTSBURGH -- (NPI)--Sengstacke Publications said it is now the largest Negro publishing chain in the world as it announced purchase of the Pittsburgh Courier group of newspapers, excluding the Chicago Courier.

John H. Sengstacke, editor and publisher of the Chicago Daily Defender and President of Sengstacke Publications, made the announcement, which said the combined circulation of the Sengstacke papers will total 400,000 weekly.

The Daily Defender, including its weekend paper, is one of the two Negro-owned daily newspapers in the country. The other is the Atlanta Daily World. Sengstacke also owns or holds a sizable interest in the Michigan Chronicle, Detroit, Tri-State Defender, Memphis; and the Louisville Defender, Kentucky.

The Courier, one of the oldest Negro publish-ing houses in the nation, has long been identified with S. B. Fuller, manufacturing magnate. The paper published in Chicago, Pittsburgh, New York, Detroit, and Philadelphia, in addition to a national edition.

The Chicago Courier, a weekly newspaper, will remain as the Daily Defender's competition in Chicago. The city's other major Negro-owned weekly is the Chicago Crusader.




