You hear on the radio and on television, and you read in the papers that all over the country, everybody is wrapped up in next week's elections. However, sports-minded Americans spent their week-end in the usual manner attending or viewing on television basketball, football, golf, sports car racing, and boxing just as they do on every week-end. . . . And there was much sports fare for the spectators.

On the Basketball scene, the San Francisco offense-minded WARRIORS came up with some "just in time" defense Friday to beat Baltimore 105-104. . . . NATE THURMAN, the Warrior's Center had 19 points in 25 rebounds, and blocked a shot by GUS JOHNSON that would have tied the score while the Los Angeles LAKERS, without the services of their two stars, ELGIN BAYLOR and JERRY LEWIS, defeated the New York KNICKERBOCKERS 124-114.

In Pro Football, JOHNNY UNITAS becomes the National League's All-Time Record Passer and celebrated the event by tossing an 89-yard touchdown bomb to JOHN MACKEY while leading the Baltimore COLTS to a 17-3 victory over the Los Angeles RAMS. . . . The San Diego CHARGERS eked out a thriller over the hard-fighting Denver BRONCOS 24-17 and the Green Bay Packers ELIJAH PITES swivel-hipped and dipped to three touchdowns and played a part in setting up the other two touchdowns that carried the league-leading PACKERS to a 31-7 victory over the Detroit LIONS. . . . With the elusive running of fleet LEROY KELLY and the great passing of FRANK RYAN, the Cleveland BROWNS ran all over the Atlanta FALCONS racking up a 49-17 win. . . . The Kansas City CHIEFS came to life inspired by the razzle-dazzle running of sensational rookie half-back MIKE GARRET and hung the Houston OILERS out to dry 48-23. . . . Boston PATRIOT'S fullback, JIM NANCE, set a club record with two touchdowns while leading his team to 24-21 victory over the Oakland RAIDERS. . . . And the Washington REDSKINS slipped to the Philadelphia EAGLES 27-13.

Collegiate football saw the Miami HURRICANES upset USC in a surprise thriller 10-7. . . . NOTRE DAME, looking like the Fighting Irish of old, destroyed NAVY 35-0 and MICHIGAN STATE, being the championship team it is, surprised nobody in running over NORTHWESTERN again 27-0.

The local highschool gridiron action found MOAPA VALLEY rallying for two touchdowns in the final period to claim its second straight Southern Conference Class A title Friday night by defeating a surprisingly stubborn VIRGIN VALLEY team 19-6. . . . The Clark High CHARGERS rolled to their fourth straight Highschool win by downing the Basic WOLVES 27-6. . . . He made 161 1/2 pound JOE NARDI of Chicago his 5th straight KO victim in the second round before nearly 1,000 fans at the Richmond auditorium in Richmond, California. . . . BILLY WALKER suffered an upset in trying to win his 6th straight bout, being subdued by that experienced gladiator of the squared circle, TONY MONTANA of Phoenix, Arizona. . . . WALKER gave the veteran a tremendous battle for five rounds, but MONTANA'S experience paid off in the late rounds, and earned him a close but well-deserved victory. . . . As expected, CARLOS ORTIZ is still recognized by WBA as Lightweight Champion of the World after the curious circumstances of that fight against SUGAR RAMOS in Mexico City. . . . The fight, thus far, is considered "no contest", and has been rescheduled to be fought in the near future at a yet undetermined site. . . . Former Heavyweight Champ, SONNY LISTON has begun serious training at Chuck's Gym in the Golden West Shopping Center.

BOND SUPPORT GROWS

WASHINGTON, D. C. -- (NPI)--The U. S. Supreme court last week was asked in an amicus curiae (friend-of-the-court) brief filed by the American Jewish Congress to overturn a judgement against elected Negro legislator Julian Bond who twice was denied a seat in the Georgia House of Representatives because of his views on the war in Viet Nam.

The AJC asked the high court to reverse the judgement by the U. S. District Court for Northern Georgia upholding the Georgia legislature on three counts, including one that the people who twice elected him are unconstitutionally being denied representation. It also said Bond's freedom of speech was violated, and that the Georgia House excluded him in violation of Article IV, Section 4 of the Constitution.

POTENTIAL NEGRO ASTRONAUT - AGAIN

CHICAGO--(NPI)--A 30-year-old, Chicago-born Air Force captain with a Ph.D. in physical chemistry, may become the nation's first Negro astronaut. He is Capt. Robert Henry Lawrence Jr., who is in the Aerospace Research Pilot Training Program, Edwards Air Force Base, California. The program has graduated such famous astronauts as James McDivitt, Dave Scott, Elliott See and Charles Bassette. Discussing Capt. Lawrence's chances to become an outer space traveler Lt. William P. Campbell, base information officer, said: "Capt.

Lawrence is indeed one of the pilots in the school, and it is conceivable that he will become a member of the outer space program." He also confirmed that Lawrence is undergoing special training "which will qualify him as an astronaut."

A graduate of Englewood High School, Lawrence also holds the B. S. degree in Chemistry from Bradley University, and is a product of the school's ROTC training.

He is married to the former Miss Barbara Cross, Chicago, and is the father of a seven-year-old boy, Tracey.
