### **EDUCATION BENEFITS**

WASHINGTON, The Supplemental Appropriation Bill passed by the Senate carries more than \$3 million in Federal support for public education and libraries in Nevada, Senator Alan Bible reported.

BIBLE, A Senate Appropriations Committee member, said more than \$2 million of the total was for public school assistance under the Aid to Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

Nevada funds to support higher education facilities total \$731,924, Bible said, and the state allocation for library services and construction is \$291,679. Bible gave this breakdown of the \$2 million in school aid to Nevada:

Assistance to school districts with low-income families, \$1,181,858; grants for school library materials, \$233,217; supplementary educational centers and services, \$466,527; strengthening state education departments, \$133,251.

The Education and Library programs were funded in the Supplementary Bill because of delayed authorizations, Bible said. None of the Nevada allocations will be at issue when this final money bill of the session goes to Conference, he added.

## ANOTHER ALTAR WAITS FOR THE CHURCH

"NO MAN'S LAND"
Starting statistics revealed by an eminent sociologist give some explanation for much that is happening to the Negro in this period of his existence.

In 1910, 73 per cent of the nation's Negro population lived in the South with 60 per cent of these residing in rural areas. In 1960, 73 per cent of the US's Negro population lived in urban, metropolitan areas.

Considering the sub-standard educational facilities available to the children of these two generations, it is no wonder that our metropolitan school systems, formerly geared academically to a white middle-class population, have in recent years failed to educate a predominant Negro population now resident in the inner city.

Education is not the only area making the problem so complex. It is utterly impossible to take any racial or ethnic group out of rural customs, traditions and mores and urbanize them in so short a span of time. And thus, for a large percentage of the 73 per cent Negro population now residing in our cities, other cultural lags are easily recognizable.

The proliferation of the Negro church in metropolitan areas is indicative of the fact that the newcomers find a church in which they feel more at home. In any metropolitan area, you can go down the Negro business streets and count two to six storefront churches in one block.

Closer investigation will reveal that many follow family or regional lines developing the membership. There are so many places and situations foreign to the newcomer that he is glad to find some consolation in being able to identify through his church affiliation with some of his past.

But what need, beyond familiar relationships, is being filled by the majority of the Negro's

storefront churches?

I knew a Methodist and Baptist preacher, who, nearly 40 years ago made it their ministry to meet trains coming from the South each day to a northern city. They would personally see that the newcomers had a place to live, a job, or money, food and lodging to tide them over until they got started.

#### UNIVERSITY REGENT

In a speech at the B'nai B'rith candidates night on Thursday evening Dr. Juanita White challenged her opponent's proposal that the legislature establish two separate universities under separate Boards of Regents. She said that such action would be unconstitutional in Nevada.

The Nevada constitution provides for the establishment of A university by the legislature and states that THE university shall be controlled by A Board of Regents. This statement has been interpreted as providing ONE university only, repeatedly in the past.

It would require many years to make such a change in the constitution of the state for the bill must be passed by two regular sessions of the legislature, and then it must go before the general public for approval in a statewide referendum. Then, and only then, could the bill become an amendment to the state constitution.

Dr. White stated that the establishment of separate universities with separate Boards of Regents is unnecessary and undesirable for such action would harm the progress of higher education in the whole state of Nevada. It would create more rivalry and stimulation sectionalism that is undesirable.
