LEWISBORO, N. Y.--(NPI)--Jackie Robinsonobtained a permit to open an interracial country club, despite objections by area residents, who charged that club members might make too much noise.

Robinson, former star with the Brooklyn Dodgers, heads the club, to be called the Pheasant Valley Golf and Country club. It will be located about 40 miles from Manhattan, near the Connecticut border.

Residents living near the site of the proposed club charged the club might produce noise and traffic in the rural area. However, town officials approved it anyway.

Money In -Prejudice Out

NEW ORLEANS-(NPI)-The Crescent City, which has had much experience and trouble in sports, seems about to come into its own through big time football. The National Football league has selected New Orleans as the 16th major city where big time football will be played. The team will temporarily use the Sugar Bowl stadium while a new covered dome is being prepared.

New Orleans has been plagued by disasters in sports and most of it has come as a result of its racial prejudice. The city lost its minor league team—the New Orleans Pelicans—due to the unwillingness of the team to accept Negroes as players and to seat Negroes in the park on an unsegregated basis.

New Orleans then got its big black eye when it discriminated against the Negro players in an exhibition game and the players left as a consequence.

Now racial segregation is about ended in hotels, athletic contests, restaurants, etc. and New Orleans seems on its way again to big time in sports.

New Orleans once led the entire country in sports. The biggest fights of yesteryear were fought here. It now has everything a sports town wants, weather, lots of people, fine stadia and at least a restrained segregation attitude.
