FIVE SMOOTH STONES. By Ann Fairbairn. New York: Crown Publishers; Inc. 756 pp. \$6.95.

This important new novel is the story of one man's part in the Negro revolution. It begins with his birth in New Orleans in 1933 and carries him through 30 years, to just before the passing by Congress of the first important civil rights

The man, David Champlin, blessed with the spiritual heritage of a great people, is materially blessed by a chain of fortuitous circumstances that pushed him upward on the ladder of achievement.

David never loses touch, either spiritually or actually, with the grandfather who reared him. Yet from the time he enters college, he lives for the most part in a white world, prompting the older Negro attorney with whom he practices, to call him a "dweller on two planets."

David best describes his own dilemma when he replies "...the trouble is, Brad, I'm still nothing but the brown-skin grandson of Li'l Joe Champlin who happened to have the luck and the savvy to make it through Pengard, Harvard, and Oxford... with the help of a great guy from Denmark. I'm not screaming loud screams of self-pity. I'm a Negro, close to my roots and proud of it....

ABORTION AND THE LAW. By David Lowe. New York: Pocket Books. 166 pp. \$1.00.

The third largest racket in the United States is the sale of illegal, criminal abortions. One million are performed in this country every year.

This book by the late David Lowe, sets forth the issues of legalizing abortion as they are argued pro and con by doctors, lawyers, clergymen, and the non-professional people who have been directly involved.

In discussing abortion, Lowe devoted half of his book to case studies. One of the main facts brought out by him is that the majority of women (from all social and economic levels) seeking abortions are not single girls. Of the million women aborted every year, more than 80

per cent are performed on married women.
According to Dr. Edwin Gold, director of obstetrics and gynecology, Brooklyn hospital, New York, "If we were to give a profile of the most common situation in which a woman requests termination of pregnancy, we should describe a married woman with two or three children...between 28 and 40.


