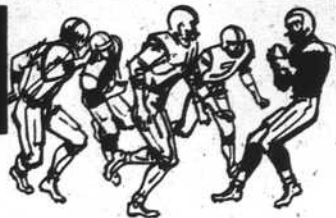


# SPORTS

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### Dixie Double Standard

LITTLE ROCK - (NPI)--A study team of 28 law students, has documented the double standard of "Dixie justice" in rape cases.

THE STUDY, which embraced 19 counties and 55 rape cases dating back two decades, was undertaken by the law students, consulting criminal lawyers, criminologists and statisticians.

The findings: Of 19 Negroes convicted of raping white women, nine were sentenced to death. Where both the man and the women were either white or black, only five death sentences were imposed.

No convictions were found for white men charged with raping Negro women.

The findings were cited in a NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund brief before the U.S. Supreme Court in defense of William L. Maxwell, 26, who was convicted of raping a white woman.

THE BRIEF depicts Maxwell as the victim of a Southern pattern in which Negroes convicted of raping white women are likely to get the death penalty.

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
