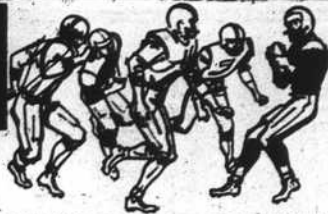


SPORTS

MR. BROOKS GOES TO WASHINGTON - ALONE

BOSTON - (NPI)--Sen.-elect Edward W. Brooke will leave his family in Massachusetts when he goes to Washington next month to become the first Negro U.S. Senator in this century.

BROOKE HAS explained that he does not want to take his two daughters, Remi and Edwina, out of school. His two teenage daughters attend all-white schools.

The senator-elect said he would commute between his Washington and his Massachusetts home until at least next June. The Massachusetts attorney general plans to live in the residence of his mother, Mrs. Helen Brooke, who has a home in the northeast section of Washington, where Brooke was born and raised. His father, who died two years ago, and his mother remained there.

Brooke plans to take French lessons so he can work closely with the French speaking African nations in his new role as senator. One language he won't need to learn is Italian, which his wife Remigia, of Italian ancestry, has taught him.

The Brooke family lives in a \$30,000 house on Beacon street in the all-white Boston suburb of Newton. They own a summer home on Martha's Vineyard, off Cape Cod, and spend many weekends there.

As attorney general, Brooke was not often able to be with his family. And now, as a U.S. senator, living hundreds of miles from his family, he would be with them less than ever.
