Motor Vehicle Office Open All Day Saturday

CARSON CITY--As a special service, designed to lessen the final day's rush of the 1967 motor vehicle registration period, the Department of Motor Vehicles' branch offices in Las Vegas and North Las Vegas will remain open all day Saturday (January 28), Director Art Latta announced today.

"Motor vehicle registrations, processed over-the-counter, are currently running several thousand behind last year's totals. We hope to absorb as great a number as possible by remaining open on the final Saturday before the January 31st deadline for obtaining 1967 vehicle registrations," Latta stated.

"Furthermore, the new and unprecedented registration service on Saturday will allow those who must come to the Department to register but work from 8 to 5 during the week, to register without taking time off from their jobs," he added.

Also, in order to spread out the work load, Latta advised all residents, who must come into the Department in order to register a vehicle to use the branch office closest to their residence.

"IN OTHER WORDS," he stated, "we urge those who live north of Bonanza in Las Vegas, North Las Vegas and Nellis Air Force Base residents to use the North Las Vegas Branch Office, at 1901 Jefferson, just one block off Las Vegas Boulevard North; and those living south of Bonanza and in the county in the "Strip" region to use the Las Vegas Branch Office at 3105 East Sahara Avenue."

Latta urged that everyone who received a renewal form in the mail from the Department to utilize the renewal-by-mail program and avoid any last-minute rush and the traditional long wait in line.

"All a person need do is mail the IBM-prepared renewal form back to Carson City, along with a check or money order for the amount indicated on the renewal form," the director explained.

VETERANS, widows and orphans eligible for the exemption should obtain a Certificate of Exemption from the County Assessor--located in the Clark County Court House--and enclose this with their renewal registration material if they wish to utilize the mail.

Deadline for obtaining a 1967 Nevada motor vehicle registration is January 31st. After this date, a late penalty of \$3, plus 10 percent of the vehicle's "'privilege tax''--but not less than \$3--must be charged.

"This means that persons registering late will face a minimum of \$6 penalty," Latta concluded.
