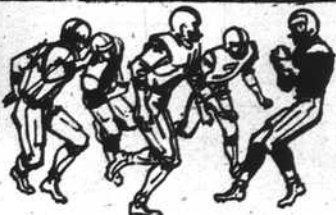

Former Nevada Heavyweight Champion Howard "Honey Boy" King is back on the local scene under circumstances which portend the great future for the fighter his potential has indicated and which is so long overdue. King has been residing in Stockton, California where he has continued to earnestly train for readiness when opportunity knocked. In this case, the door of opportunity was opened by no other than his former trainer, Red Williams of "The Place" who had once vowed that some day he would become the manager of the great Heavyweight.
