Also at 4 p.m., there will be a Progress Days Carnival featuring the SJM Fiesta Shows on the carnival grounds at Lake Mead Blvd., and McDaniel Street. Wednesday morning and evening the Progress Days Bowling Tournament for League bowlers will take place at College Park Lanes.
