BOSTON - (NPI)--When the 58th annual convention of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People convenes in July 10-15, it will mark the historical return to the State of Massachusetts of the 19th century movement to abolish slavery in America.

This year's convention expected to attract more than 2,000 delegates from 1,800 NAACP units in 50 states, will have as guest speakers Gov. John A. Volpe and Mayor John Collins, both of whom have accepted invitations to address the confab.

Preparations for the convention are in the hands of a Committee on Convention Procedures, headed by Keesler Montgomery, Boston, as Chairman; and Miss Inez Hale, New Orleans, Secretary.

Among the entertainment features to be provided will be an "NAACP Night" at Fenway Park, home of the Boston Red Sox baseball team. The team's management has announced that it will play host to visiting delegates on that night.
