

In the March 9 issue of the VOICE, a pictorial account was given of the efforts of a group of housewives in the Las Vegas area who have committed themselves to service as volunteer aides in the Community Aid to Education pro-gram sponsored by the Ministerial Association. Mrs. Edythe Katz, who serves as coordinator of the volunteer group for the Association, reports that the response to the program is more than gratifying, and the involvement of the women volunteer aides grows more enthusiastic daily.

The most recent activity in the Community Aid to Education movement, is the Adoptive Program wherein organizations adopt an individual school. This gives women opportunity to assist the program who cannot commit them-selves to regular hours of working in the schools as is mandatory of the aides. The Sisterhood of Temple Beth Shalom adopted the Kit Carson School, and it is indicative of the interest in the program held by these women that Mrs. Sam Speiser, the Temple's current President will replace Mrs. Rousso as Social Action Chairman so that Mrs. Rousso can work directly with the school. The Social Action Chairman serves as liaison between the organization and the school.

The money donated to the school will be used to defray expenses incurred from the school's recent camping trip, for speech tapes, educational toys for the smaller children, and for any extra curricular activities not afforded by the District.

Women of the Greek Orthodox Church have adopted Cashman Junior High School under the Adoptive Program and have provided much needed assistance in collecting books for the schools, furnishing material for students to make their gym uniforms in their home economic classes, and aid in any form where there is need.
