Penalty for violation of this provision, is expulsion from the council.

UC Disclosure Of Negro Attitudes

Round-Up BERKELEY, Calif. - (NPI)--A University of California study has disclosed that few Negroes support black nationalism oppose the draft or support black nationalism, oppose the draft, or hate whites. The survey found, in general, that Negroes are less anti-Semitic than whites, and favor Jews over other whites to the degree that they distinguished between them. Less than a third of Negroes surveyed were strongly anti-white. The "more militant a Negro is, the less likely he is to be anti-white," it was found.

Negro Opinion Studies Reveal Opposing Views

NEW YORK - (NPI)--Two studies of Negro opinion have disputed currently held views that Negroes do not support the nation's military policies.

A University of California Survey Research center study found that nearly 90 per cent of the Negroes queried indicated a willingness to fight for the United States.

Majorities ranged from 83 per cent in New York to 91 per cent in Birmingham.

Meanwhile, a Louis Harris survey revealed that 48 per cent of 160 Negroes interviewed disagreed with Dr. Martin Luther King's outspoken opposition to the Vietnam war.

Twenty-five per cent said they agreed with his position, and 27 per cent reserved judgment.
