





RIOT POWER: PRO AND CON

NEGRO AND white ministers responded in large numbers to the call of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., last year to come to Chicago's West Side to patrol the streets after the first night of rioting.

Despite the fact that many wore clerical attire, we were advised to also wear a WSO (West Side Organization) button, so that west-side residents would know we were friends and not foes. Those of us who patrolled felt that it was the button rather than our visible clergy look that appealed to calmness.

A few weeks ago, while discussing the aftermath of riots with a civil rights friend (before Cincinnati, Boston, Dayton, Tampa, Atlanta and Los Angeles) we were hung up on whether or not, if such an occasion arose again this year, we would be so quick to gointo "foreign" territory to imply that we represented an authority come to restore order.

Would not such a visible authority represent an extension of police power?
