

RAPID TEMPERATURE changes will kill minnows. Insulated bait containers will inhibit rapid change in temperature and will keep the bait much better. Picnic iceboxes are ideal as bait boxes. Styrofoam boxes are good because they sort of breathe keeping the water cool and oxygenated at the same time. The only problem with styrofoam plastic is that it is very fragile and easily broken. The regular picnic boxes are better because they are more durable.

WHEN MINNOWS all come to the surface of the water, it is because the oxygen is getting low in the water. The bait water can be aerated (adding oxygen) by blowing air through a tube or pipe with the other end held near the bottom of the bait container. Blow several good long breaths into the water, but not too forcefully, because it will spook the minnows. Repeat as often as necessary until minnows stay in a huddle at the bottom.

TEST THE water temperature with your hand. Be sure there is no oil or gasoline on your hand before sticking it in the bait box. If the water seems warm, gradually cool it by adding a little lake water (coffee can is ideal for this) to the bait, then bail out the same amount of bait water--repeat this procedure about 6 or 8 times until the bait water seems to be a little cooler.

ALWAYS ANCHOR with your bow headed into the wind. If there is only a gentle wind, then anchor with your bow headed up current. To prevent fanning of your boat back and forth, use a stern anchor after your front anchor has gotten a firm hold. A cement block fastened with a chain which is tied to anchor rope is usually adequate as a stern anchor to limit fanning of your boat. Drop the block straight down while your boat is headed straight into the wind or into the current. When the cement block strikes bottom, make your line fast with no slack in the line.

A CLEAN boat bottom saves gas and in-

creases speed.

Clean the bottom with a scouring powder like Ajax and, after drying, put a coat of wax or silicone polish on the boat bottom. The polish will help keep scum from sticking to boat and will increase speed of the boat.

REMOVE THE bilge plug from your boat after each trip. Leave plug out until you are ready to make the next trip. This will prevent bilge rot and bilge odors. It also permits gasoline vapors to escape and prevents much of the danger of explosion and fire which results from accumulation of these dangerous vapors.

For God's sake don't forget to replace the bilge plug before you put your boat back into the water.

USE YOUR motor to assist the hand winch when putting your boat back on the boat trailer. Be certain that your propeller is clear of the bottom before attempting this procedure. Know your boat and the prop clearance when your boat is on the trailer.

If your prop remains clear when the motor is down and the boat is on the trailer, there is little possibility that you will damage the prop by using it to push your boat onto the trailer. You can also use your motor to help get the trailer out of the water when your car wheels spin and won't pull you out. Put your motor in gear and give it gas and you will push the trailer ahead enough so your car will pull you out.

Naturally, it takes two people to do this.



The fights will be carried by closed circuit TV to Mexico and by Satellite to Great Britain and Japan. The winners will move into the semifinals of the controversial make-believe WBA tournament. Other semi-finalists will be the winners of a Sept. 16 Frankfurt, Germany match between Karl Mildenberger and Oscar Bonavena and winners of the Oct. 28 bout between Floyd Patterson and Jerry Quarry to be held in Los Angeles.
