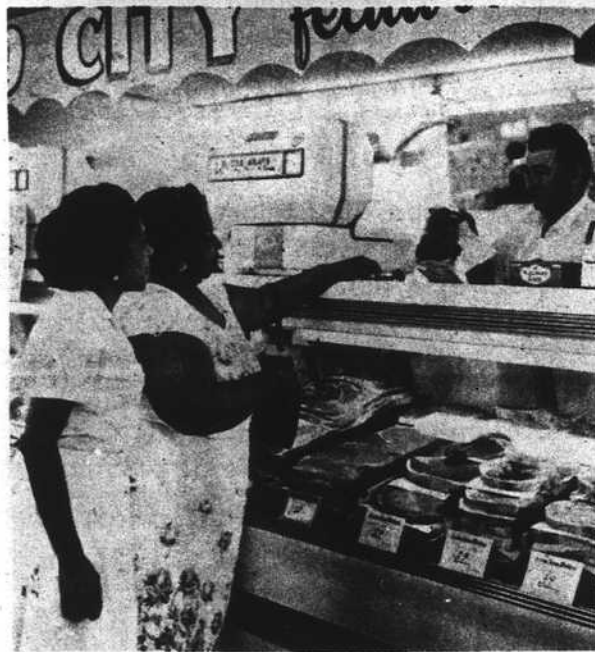


Food City Is Where It's At!

Executive Appointment To Atlanta U Woman Grad

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. - (NPI)--A graduate of Atlanta University's School of Social Work has the \$15,000-year position as executive director of the Jefferson County Committee for Economic Opportunity.

She is Mrs. Amyle F. Boykin, a mother of four children--three boys and one girl. She is responsible for a set-up of \$5.5 million which consists of a network of supportive and delegate agencies.

Mrs. Boykin, who has been with the Birmingham Community Action (CAP) organization since its inception approximately 23 months ago, was appointed JCCEO executive director last Aug. 7. She succeeded John Carr who resigned to accept the position of Superintendent of the Alabama Boys Industrial school.

The NCCEO Board of Directors is made up of representation from the Birmingham city government; the Jefferson County government level, neighborhood Advisory Councils, community-service organizations, together with public and private agencies.

Her appointment came from the JCCEO Board of Directors which has a majority of white members on it. She was approved for the CAP executive director position by a vote which was recorded as unanimous.

From June 17 to Aug. 7, 1967, she served as the acting executive director for the Jefferson County Committee for Economic Opportunity. Between the period Nov. 15, 1965 to June 16, 1967, Mrs. Boykin was assistant director, Jefferson County Committee for Economic Opportunity.
