ADAM POWELL'S CLAIM Red Necks With Red Faces A PROBLEM TO COURT.



WASHINGTON - (NPI)--The head of a three-judge appellate court, looking into Adam Clayton Powell's claim to his House seat, has expressed concern that a ruling in Powell's favor might play the courts off against Congress.

Judge Warren E. Burger questioned whether the judiciary has the authority to order Congress to reseat Powell, who was ousted by the House.

What would happen, Burger asked, if the House passed a resolution directing Speaker John McCormack not to swear in Powell, after federal courts upheld his right to his seat?

NEW ORLEANS - (NPI)--Heads of the private and segregated school system in Plaquemines parish (county) had very red faces last week. This is Perez country and the school authorities are accused of having stolen books from public schools and taken them to private segregated schools.

A federal judge took hold of the situation and told the authorities to either return the books to their proper places in the public school system or be held in contempt of court. The authorities fumed, fussed, howled, but the books got back in some manner.

"Poor Man's" Conference Has "Sponsored" Backing

WASHINGTON - (NPI)--Four days of "Congressional hearings" on behalf of a 10-year, \$185-billion "Freedom Budget" will be held in the city beginning Oct. 16.

The meeting is billed as a "poor people's conference"--but its sponsors are not poor, and its purpose has already been determined.

Organizer of the hearings is the Citywide Community Action Groups, an affiliation of New York City anti-poverty organizations seeking larger Congressional appropriations.

Conference sponsors hope to bring a thousand poor people to the city by chartered bus from New York each day of the hearings and to have representatives from anti-poverty groups throughout the nation present.

In the "Freedom Budget," to be promoted at the hearings, are proposals for a guaranteed annual income, increased welfare and social security benefits, full employment, and health, educational, and housing opportunities.
