Wirtz Appointment For Head Of Women's Council

WASHINGTON - (NPI)--Miss Dorothy I. Height, president, National Council of Negro Women, Inc., was among three prominent persons appointed recently to serve on the National Manpower Advisory Committee.

Her appointment, effective Sept. 29, along with those of Dr. C. E. Bishop, vice president, University of North Carolina, and Howard W. Johnson, president, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, were announced by U.S. Labor Secretary Willard Wirtz.

The committee advises the Secretary of Labor in carrying out his duties under the Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962.
