WASHINGTON - (NPI)--Racial discrimination against Negro GIs in Vietnam? It's rare, according to Pentagon spokesmen, who denied reports of assigning Negro troops to especially hazardous duty. According to the Defense De-partment, servicemen on "rest and relaxation" passes will not be sent to areas practicing racial discrimination. RESUMED

CLARKSDALE, Miss. - (NPI) -- Picketing of City Hall, the phone company, and large department stores has been resumed by the local NAACP branch, which charges that Jim Crow, is still flying high in this community. The demonstrators filed discrimination complaints with the county welfare director during protests led by Aaron E. Henry, Mississippi NAACP president, and Mrs. Vera Pigee, Clarksdale branch secretary. WARNING

MINEOLA, L.I. - (NPI)--Long Island volunteer fire departments have been warned to spend less time discriminating against Negroes and more time putting out fires. The New York State Commission for Human Rights, which issued the warning, said it would vigorously enforce a new state law banning discrimination by the volunteer units. The state commission's new Negro chairman, Robert H. Mangum, said he was "shocked that we have to pass a law to enable someone to put out a fire.'

POLICE PLAN

DAYTON, Ohio - (NPI) -- Mayor Dave Hall has proposed a plan to put more Negroes on the police force. Although Negroes make up 29 per cent, or 77,600 of Dayton's 267,500 population, only 4 per cent or 16 of the 401 men on the force are Negroes, the mayor said. The proposal was made after Robert Elwood Barbee, a Negro civil rights worker, was shot to death by a white policeman, later charged with first-degree manslaughter.

CLAIM IDENTITY OF "RAM" LEADER KNOWN

PHILADELPHIA - (NPI)--An unidentified investigator of the Revolutionary Action Movement, an ultra-militant group reported to have plotted the assassination of President Lyndon Johnson and other key U.S. leaders, declared last week that Robert F. Williams, formerly of Monroe, N.C., is the leader in exile of the bizarre scheme.

Williams, former leader of the Union County (N.C.) NAACP, fled the United States several years ago rather than stand trial in the South for what he described as a trumped-up charge against him of involvement in the kidnapping of a white couple.

He went to Cuba, where he launched a campaign against "U.S. imperialism, fascism and racism." He is now said to be living in Communist China and last week was expected to be an honored guest at the National Day celebration in Peking.

THE LINKING of Williams with the plot by RAM to assassinate top U.S. and city officials and dynamite public buildings came to light as huge bonds were set for six RAM members, reported to be connected to the plot. The bail, set by Judge Lee Weinrott, totaled nearly \$200,000. Local police are still seeking a sev-enth member of the group.

Williams is editor of a newsletter called the "Crusader" which attacked racism in the United States and which has been banned in America. Williams charged that President Johnson was responsible for the banning.

The investigator here said Williams had learned "armed revolution" from the master ---Chairman Mao.

In addition to the President, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover was also marked for assassination. The plot by RAM, which is rumored to have Communist leanings, was uncovered when two members tipped-off local authorities.
