## "The Crappie Catcher"

Put on an extra set of long handles, gas up your water buggy, pick up plenty of small crappie minnows, and head for the ICEBERG CANYON. The Crappie are there, You should have some kind of heat aboard your boat, because the nights are very cold.

If you don't have a bottled gas stove, you can make an excellent charcoal stove with very little effort, and at no expense. Take a 5 gallon paint bucket, which is made of fairly heavy sheet metal, and which has a heavy metal top. Scrape out all the old paint so that you won't be bothered with the smelly fumes of burning paint when you get your fire going. Place 5 to 6 inches of stones, pebbles, or broken pieces of cement or brick in the bottom of the paint bucket. Take a large nail and drive a ring of holes around the bottom of the bucket, 2 to 3 inches from bottom. The holes should be about an inch apart, and should ring the bucket at a level midway the 4 to 6 inches of stones which you placed in the bottom.

The stones on the bottom of the paint bucket are to prevent the bottom from over heating. The holes you put in the bucket are to allow air to enter so as to create a draft for your fire. Be sure to save the top of the paint cant. It will serve a double purpose. You set it on loosely when you want to use it as a stove top for your coffee pot or frying pan. You set the top on tightly when you want to slow down, or put our your fire.

A 10-pound sack of charcoal will keep a good fire going all night. When your fire gets too hot, put the lid on the can. When it is not hot enough, leave the lid off.

Keep a can of charcoal starter on your boat at all times. It comes in very handy when you want to start your boat stove burning, and also when you beach your boat and want to start a camp fire with damp drift wood.

With your paint bucket charcoal stove, and your extra pair of longies, you can stay as warm as a mother's love while you load up with craphes

load up with crappies.
Have your gasoline lanterns in good shape, Always keep extra mantles, and an extra generator in your tackle box. To throw more light on the water, and to keep the glare out of your eyes, take a roll of aluminum foil along.


INJURY BOTHERS BEARS
