Red was using shrimp. Bishop and DeWitt were using waterdogs and shrimp. The larger fish were caught on dogs.

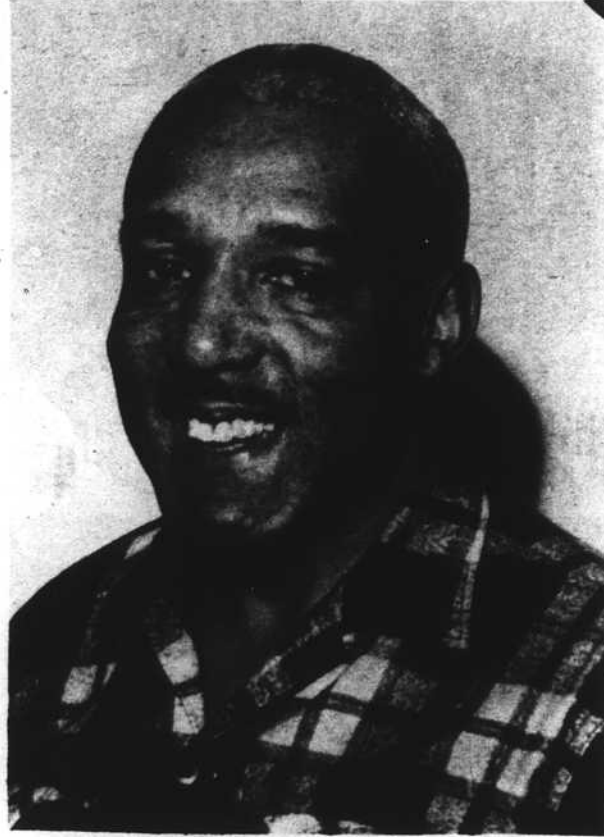
REMEMBER THE C.C. has predicted the Crappie are going to school up and bite like Crappie should on the dark of the November moon, which should be right at this very time.

## Las Vegas' Lee White Sets Gridiron Records

Las Vegas High School fans and grads can walk tall with inflated chests as they extol the gridiron feats of a former Wildcat who became a full grown tiger at Weber State College in Ogden, Utah.

Lee White, 'little' brother of Luther White, both of whom played a lot of football at Las Vegas Hi, became a Weber State College legend during his three record setting years of playing varsity football at the Utah college.

Luther, older brother of Lee, would have been something of a legend himself if his 'little' 240 pound 6'4" brother had not been burning the Weber State turf at the same time. Luther White set a few campus records himself, but his feats were buried by the greatness of his younger brother, Lee.

Luther established a Weber State record for most interceptions.

LEE WHITE set 7 Weber State records. Several of Lee's records are destined to stand for many years. He closed out his college career with a performance that attracted almost as many pro ball scouts as it did fans during Weber State's 10-game schedule.

Lee put on a show in every game. He averaged 137.8 yards gained per game--1378 yards for the year.

During his 3 years of varsity performance, he gained 3,062 yards rushing. He scored 34 touchdowns, 208 points and, in a single game, gained 276 yards against Idaho. All were college records, and every one of them is going to be difficult for future Weber State footballers to exceed.

Lee White, former Nevada all state gridder, is a natural for pro ball. He may be overlooked by the All-America judges because Weber State is not a major college, but you can bet next month's rent and car note that a few professional scouts will be trampled in the rush to sign this phenom of the gridiron.

Lee White, son of Mr. and Mrs. Luther White of Las Vegas, is married to former debutante Queen Debbie Roberts, daughter of Gentleman Jim Roberts, Maitre'd of the Las Vegas Press Club.

P.S. Don't be surprised if you witness papa Luther or papa-in-law, Jim, busting buttons off their proud boasting chests, but remember that neither one of them gained a single one of those 3062 yards, or made just one of those 34 touchdowns. If Debbie boasts a little bit that's her right because Big Lee is her guy.



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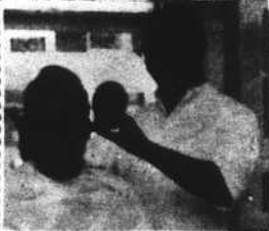
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
