Nevadans Urged To Take Test For Sake Of Safety

CARSON CITY--Nevadans everywhere--and particularly those boys and girls taking driver education courses in the state--are being encouraged to take the second National Drivers Test when it is aired nationally over CBS network on December 5, 1967.

Thousands of test forms have been obtained and are to be distributed to all schools in the state through cooperative efforts of the Department of Motor Vehicles and the State Department of Education.

Plans for the distribution of the forms were completed recently at a meeting involving E. H. (Bud) Miller, Nevada Highway Safety Coordin-ator and Bert Cooper, Driver Education Con-

sultant for the Education Department. MILLER SAID that his office had received 12,000 test forms from the National Safety Council and that over half of these would be distributed to all schools in the state so that students actually could check off their answers when the program is televised the night of December 5.

Both Miller and Cooper urged everyone to take the test--not just those students enrolled in driving courses at the various schools.

"In this repeat performance,", Miller said, "everyone will have the opportunity to retest himself on the many hazards of the highway, particularly at a time when critical winter driv-

ing conditions are approaching." Nearly 100 million viewers have watched the National Drivers Test the past three years, making it the most popular public service program ever carried on a single TV network.

Miller, whose office is charged with promot-ing safety along Nevada's highways, said that the National Drivers Test provides one of the best opportunities to get people and groups to participate in a safety activity. "Through the test they learn specific defens-

ive techniques that could save their lives", he said. The test will be shown over KOLO-TV
