
The script originally called for a boy about six years old, but Diahann reportedly felt a child that age would make her appear older than she desired, so a three-year-old had to be found.

### U.S. MOVIES BANNED IN KENYA?

LONDON -- U.S. movies will be banned in the African nation of Kenya, according to reports reaching here, unless a dispute between Kenya officials and the Motion Picture Export Assoc. is worked out by Jan. 1.

At issue is a government order that Kenya distribution be handled by the recently set up Kenya Film Corp., a government agency.
