### **Wallace In Spoiler Role**

TULARE, Calif. - (NPI) -- Ex-Governor George C. Wallace may not be elected President next year, but he'll have a good chance of throwing the election into the U.S. House of Representatives.

That is the prediction being made as the segregationist candidate picked up considerable support from whites jittery about mounting racial unrest.

The former Alabama governor, whose staff is hard at work in this city, is said to have a good chance of having his name put on the California ballot as a third-party Presidential candidate next year.

He was especially strong in areas near Negro communities. In Bell Gardens, a largely white neighborhood near Watts, the American Independent party, which is supporting Wallace, was claiming that it has become the majority party.

STATEWIDE, he isn't doing quite that well. The California poll predicted that he would get about 11 per cent of the vote in a general election. But even that percentage could produce an election deadlock that could result in no major candidate winning in California.

And if this happens in enough states, no candidate would come up with a majority of the electoral votes. And thus the election would be thrown into the House of Representatives, where each state would have one vote in electing the President.

Wallace's backers openly admitted their "spoiler" role in the Presidential race. They weren't seriously hoping to win, but they were hoping to siphon off just enough support in each of the states to keep the major Republican and Democratic candidates from getting a majority of the electoral votes.

The result would be election chaos--just the thing that would put Wallace in the driver's seat.

Throwing the election into the House of Representatives would give Southerners power they've never had before. To be elected, a President would have to agree to their terms, as Southern Congressmen and their allies would have as many votes as Northern representatives.

BESIDES, THE national confusion over the election would produce just the desired anxiety and perplexity that would turn Americans toward a demagogic candidate like Wallace--or someone of his choosing.

Wallace is an especial threat in the 1968 Presidential elections, in which no major candidates are yet running strongly.

Several national polls have indicated that President Johnson is losing popularity over the Vietnam issue--development that could weaken Democratic chances in 1968, regardless of whom the party nominates.

And the Republicans have yet to come up with a strong contender against Mr. Johnson.

The more Wallace continues to rail against open housing, "rioters, anarchists, and Communists," the more popularity he gains among fearful whites--and the more he becomes a candidate to worry about.

#### **MAKE IT A SAFE XMAS**

The Las Vegas Police Department suggests the following general rules for safeguarding your property against loss to thieves.

SAFETY EQUIPMENT FOR THE HOME:

- When you move into a new house, or apartment have the locks re-keyed immediately.
- Use pin tumbler locks on outside doors.
   if your door has a glass panel, use a
   double cylinder lock requiring a key in side.
- Put a chain lock on your front door. Keep it short so no one can reach in to unfasten it from the outside.
- Wherever possible have a peephole installed in your front door.

WHEN YOU ARE AT HOME:

- Don't leave your door unlocked or ajar even when you are at home.
- 2. Don't open your door to strangers, keep it chained.
- 3. DO demand credentials before admitting salesmen or repairmen. If you are suspicious call the police.
- 4. Be wary of wrong number telephone calls, especially if they are frequent. Often they are made to find out if anyone is at home.

#### Warning Issued On Drinking & Driving

CARSON CITY--More and more we're beginning to realize how often alcohol is involved in traffic accidents. With these words, Nevada Highway Safety Coordinator E. H. (Bud) Miller sounded an especially important warning for the holidays ahead.

"New studies show that drinking is involved in as many as half the fatal traffic accidents," the safety official emphasized. "These estimates involve no special time of year; so during the season of parties and celebrations, the implications are even more frightening."

Miller's forewarning was clear: If the holidays are to be kept from being disastrous for many people and many cars in Nevada, care and common sense adjustments will have to replace the usual holiday carelessness.

"Alcohol dulls our senses and deadens restraints that usually govern our behavior," he continued. "In short, liquor influences us to take chances and do things we normally wouldn't do."

Take such a carefree attitude with you behind the wheel of your car and mix it with holiday pressures, last minute rushes and adverse weather, the stage is set for a personal disaster.

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"Be sensible," he urged. "Don't abuse traditional holiday conviviality. Horrible traffic crashes are only one of the tragic consequences that are possible.

"I can't be any more explicit than that; and I can't argue with the research findings of alcohol's adverse effects upon driving behavior. In the final analysis, what our holiday traffic record turns out to be this year will depend upon how well you adjust your actions to the cold, hard facts of reality. The answer's up to you," Miller declared.
