

### **Career Girl On Her Way**

A few months ago a girl named Brenda Arnau was working as a hairstylist at the famous Gene Shacove Salon in Beverly Hills, Calif.

Last month she was starring in a high-budget movie.

For ex-hairstylist Brenda Arnau had snared one of the hottest acting coups of the season with Fred Astaire, Petula Clark and Tommy Steele in 20th Century-Fox's "Finian's Rainbow," movie about a white man who's turned into a Negro.

And now the willowy (5'9") actress-singer is currently on an eight-week tour of the Orient, including Tokyo, Okinawa, Manila and Bangkok.

Cinderella-type climbs to overnight fame such as Brenda's are a rarity and even she is still overwhelmed by it all.

Brenda admits she owes much to the bigname clients who patronize the Shacove Salon; people like Janet Leigh, Jill St. John, Mrs. Otto-Preminger, and the wives of Steve McQueen and James Garner.

"I always wanted to sing and act professionally," says Brenda, "but it was their advice and suggestions as to how I should start which encouraged me to begin to use all my spare time to study for a serious career."

It wasn't long afterward that Duke Ellington and his orchestra performed for over 3,000 fans at Hollywood's Cocoanut Grove. Her escort for that affair just "happened to know some people" --including the Duke himself.

So Brenda climbed onto the stage and sang "Satin Doll." A wildly cheering audience begged for encore after encore and her career was launched.

Soon afterward, she auditioned for the Joey Bishop show. Paul Orr, the show's producer, was the first to hear her. He was so impressed he made a second appointment--perhaps the most important of her life--for Bishop himself to hear her.

"The day of my appointment with Joey couldn't have been worse for me," Brenda recalls. "I had teeth trouble and had to be at the dentist's two hours before the audition. I arrived at the studio following an extraction, my mouth and jaw still swollen from the novocaine."

But she sang, and Bishop liked her.
Soon after her appearance on the Bishop show, Brenda was signed for one of the starring roles in "Finian's Rainbow" and her song, "Necessity," is already being hailed as one of

the highlights of the film, which is slated to be one of the top releases of the 1968 movie season.
